Dear FIGMENT supporters and friends,

As we enter our 12th season, I honestly can't believe how far we've come since we started on Governors Island in 2007... from one event on an abandoned military base to a global movement that has created 62 events in 19 cities in 5 countries on 4 continents.

So much around us has changed in these last 12 years. That abandoned base, Governors Island, has been transformed from an unknown destination, with roughly 50,000 visitors all summer in 2007, our first year, to a redeveloped park and key part of summer in New York City, with nearly 800,000 visitors in 2017. From the beginning, we wanted Governors Island to become an international art destination; now, with the success we've been able to create collaboratively with the island and all the other producing partners, I think we can declare victory! Governors Island is a hit!

FIGMENT started in July 2007 just one week after the first iPhone was released. In the decade since, we've watched as miraculous new applications and functionality have coaxed us to spend more and more time engaging with our screens. We're only just beginning to understand the long-term impacts of this deep codependent relationship with our technology.

FIGMENT continues to stand for what we always have: empowering everyone to create and share, that creativity is a natural ability of each of us, that when we create and share it has an unrivaled ability to promote mutual understanding and empathy, and thereby build and strengthen healthy communities in our cities.

Dream Bigger at FIGMENT NYC

DREAM BIGGER is a new program at FIGMENT NYC, where, in addition to their curated projects, the team selected five high-impact participatory weekendlong projects for the FIGMENT NYC event. Colorful, photogenic, visible, highly interactive, and inviting discussion, we're excited to see Dream Bigger return in 2018.

Revamping the How-To manual

With the number of cities organizing a FIGMENT growing every year, there was a need to finetune the FIGMENT How-To manual FIGMENT's Administrative Team put together for core team members. The

updated How-To provides more resources, guidelines, best practices, brand assets, legal and other helpful documentation, and a checklist for each city to run through when putting a FIGMENT event together.

Global Fundraiser: FIGMENT Masquerade Ball

By November 8, 2017 (before our final event of the season in Phoenix) FIGMENT had hosted 61 free interactive arts events in 18 cities, in 5 countries, on 4 continents—and we continue to grow and expand. To celebrate that fact, and to help alleviate the significant strain on our finances, the FIGMENT Global team and Board of Directors held its first-ever fundraiser filled with friends, art, a silent auction and raffle, and wonderful performances. A successful stab at a high(er)-end event for our advocates and champions, we're aiming to hold another in 2018!

Over the course of five hours, 500 people visited and participated with 25 projects. The event was, by any account, a huge success, proving the concept of FIGMENT in Asia, in our first non-Western context.

2017 Financial Performance

FIGMENT is an incredibly efficient arts project, from the perspective of the amount of financial investment required in order to reach and affect a large number of people. While our total expenditures for 2017 were approximately \$242,000, we reached well over 100,000 people through our events and programs in elevent cities, our ALPHA creators' weekend, and summer-long installations on New York City's Governors Island. We are able to achieve this exceptional efficiency due to the significant volunteer resources that are contributed freely to our events and exhibitions by thousands of artists, volunteers, and team members. This in-kind contribution of volunteer time, if we were able to calculate its monetary value, would total several million dollars.

Despite a challenging economic environment for arts and culture, and many institutions and individuals exercising a great deal of caution in their charitable contributions, FIGMENT continued to expand in 2017, adding new programs and events in additional cities. In our eleven-year history, FIGMENT has always managed to break even in each season. We have learned to scale our expenditures on the fly to match the revenue that we are able to generate.

The vast majority of our revenue comes from grants from foundations, government entities, and donations from individuals. We do not accept any corporate sponsorship or advertising. Earlier in our history, we had a great deal of success in securing grants from foundations concerned with the arts and community development. However, as these foundations have reduced the size of their charitable campaigns in the last several years, we have increasingly relied on donations from individuals, the vast majority of which are small (<\$100), and include the proceeds in donations from our summer-long minigolf course on Governors Island.

Please Note: These totals by category for both income and expenses are approximate, and are based on our entire 2017 season (February to November), as opposed to our 2017 fiscal year, which runs from July 1 to June 30. As our fiscal year ends in the middle of our season, we find it helpful to look at income and expenses on the basis of the season, rather than the fiscal year, which can be misleading depending on the timing of specific income and expenses.
